# **City of Welcome**

Specifically: the progress and next steps on TAFE access for the 8000 people seeking asylum living in Sydney currently in limbo - and expected to pay international student fees! As well as the establishment of welcome committees for refugees arriving from Iraq and Syria.





Time (penalty rates, weekends and public holidays)

Specifically: how can the faiths, community and union groups work together to support the just remuneration of those working unsociable hours, protect the common good of the weekend and retain retail trading restrictions on

public holidays. For some of the lowest paid workers in Sydney, removing penalty rates represents a 25% pay cut.

**Just Urban Transitions** (renewable and affordable power)

Specifically: how you can support an exciting, major new project get off the ground in Western and Southern Sydney with ethnic communities leading the way on affordable and renewable power and advocacy on climate change and Australian aid.





## Affordable Housing & Public Transport

Housing specifics: the progress and next steps on "inclusionary rezoning", a mandated % of affordable housing in every new development. This change would mean that whenever the government has delivered new wealth through a rezoning change, developers will be compelled to include 15% of

housing that is affordable to the most vulnerable in our community, low income and essential workers like aged care and childcare workers, nurses, cleaners, women escaping domestic violence and others.

Transport specifics: How the Alliance's ratio of 400:15:1 SCA<sup>2</sup> can be re-asserted through the new Greater Sydney Commission Plans currently to public consultation. 400m to the nearest point of public transport, that comes in 15 minutes, with 1 ticket, it is Safe, Clean, Accessible and Affordable.
